UNDERDOG provides affordable sporting equipment for all youth sports as well as tools for new sports such as disc golf and pickleball. "We designed UNDERDOG Sports to meet the needs of central Illinois. There's purposeful experimentation occurring every week with the goal of constantly improving our ability to serve parents and sports enthusiasts," said Layton.
